Heritage in its past, present and future social context by Jan Kolen

In his lecture Jan will describe the work and mission of the Centre for Global Heritage and Development. This Centre was founded in 2013 by Leiden University, the Technical University of Delft and Erasmus University Rotterdam. The aim is to stimulate interdisciplinary heritage research and education. The Centre uses its highly qualified researchers, expertise and research methods, as well as its inter-university and interdisciplinary status to go beyond the traditional research of heritage, by focusing on how heritage relates to current social, cultural environmental changes.

Linking Culture and Nature by Ian Lilley

Nature and culture have long been treated separately in Western heritage management frameworks. That situation is no longer tenable as global pressures force practitioners and policy-makers to develop innovative ways to bring the two dimensions of heritage together in more holistic approaches. Focussing on World Heritage, this presentation will outline the background to the problem, and discuss some recent and current work that attempts to forge a new path forward.

Prof. Dr. J.C.A. (Jan) Kolen is professor of Landscape Archaeology and Cultural Heritage and the head of Education at the Faculty of Archaeology of Leiden University. He is also the director of the Centre for Global Heritage and Development . Formerly he was the director of the Interfaculty Research Institute for the Heritage and History of the Cultural Landscape and Urban Environment CLUE (VU, 2007-2013). Jan Kolen is especially known for developing a new approach in landscape research: “landscape biography” (PhD cum laude, 2005).

Prof. Dr. I.A. (Ian) Lilley is Professor in Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Studies at the University of Queensland in Australia. In 2015-16 he is also the inaugural Willem Willems Chair for Contemporary issues in Archaeological Heritage Management at the University of Leiden. Ian has worked in Australasian and Indo-Pacific archaeology and cultural heritage for 35 years and currently leads major projects examining Indigenous issues and human rights in World Heritage management. He is Secretary-General of the ICOMOS International Scientific Committee on Archaeological Heritage Management, and an ICOMOS World Heritage Assessor. He also serves on two IUCN Commissions. He is also Secretary-General of the Indo-Pacific Prehistory Association, the region’s peak professional body. His interests include ancient migration and trade, the development of social identity, archaeological ethics, and the role of archaeology and heritage in contemporary society.
